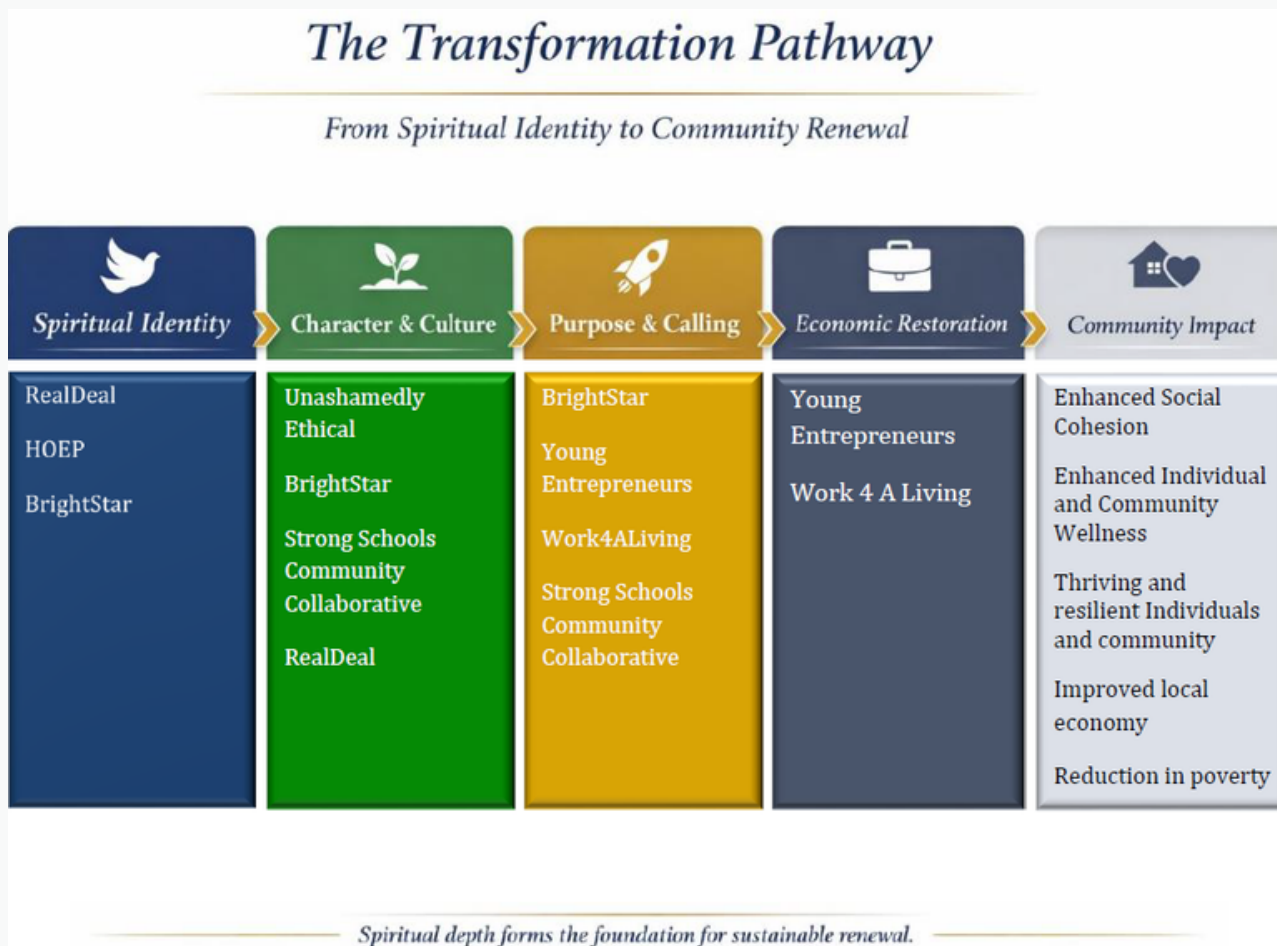

Highlight: Support Hub Meeting took place on the 11th of March 2026. Solid progress with core programmes completed, including BrightStar and Compass Calibration. Scheduled follow-up for ethics training reflects continued engagement, while Life Skills programmes are active. Some initiatives remain dependent on funding and future rollout.



Simondium Primary School

Strong Schools Compass Calibration, Unashamedly Ethical, RealDeal and HOEP.

Highlight: Support Hub Meeting took place on the 12th of March 2026. Strong implementation across core programmes, with Compass Calibration and Unashamedly Ethical training completed. The HOEP ECD Programme is progressing well. The Startwell Nutritional Programme is implemented daily and Life Skills programmes are ongoing. Leadership transition following staff retirements and limited engagement in leadership training present areas for further support.

Highlight: Support Hub Meeting took place on the 10th of March 2026. Good progress with key programmes, including successful completion of BrightStar and Compass Calibration. Wellness and Life Skills initiatives are ongoing, supported by regular engagement. Follow-up sessions for ethics training and leadership development are still required to strengthen impact.

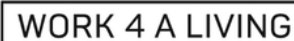

Monthly Fitness Programme Report – March 2026

The monthly fitness report for offender sessions as at 31 March 2026, facilitated by Olyvia Tiba from Emerald Foundation, reflects ongoing participation and structured physical activity across both youth and adult groups. The programme includes Medium B juvenile offenders at the Youth Centre and Medium A adult offenders. For the Medium B juveniles, fitness sessions are conducted on Mondays and Wednesdays. On both days, sessions begin with the soccer team from 09:00 to 10:00, followed by the rugby team from 10:00 to 11:00.

The final session runs from 11:00 to 12:00, with Mondays allocated to E and F sections, and Wednesdays to C and D sections. For Medium A adult offenders, rugby fitness sessions are scheduled from 09:30 to 11:00 on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. Overall performance has been positive, with the Medium B juvenile soccer team showing particularly good progress during fitness sessions, and Medium A adult offenders also demonstrating consistent engagement.

However, a recent challenge has impacted operations, as Medium A sport activities have been temporarily suspended following a stabbing incident at the correctional facility. This precautionary measure has been implemented to ensure the safety of all participants, officials, and service providers while investigations are underway. Authorities are currently reviewing security measures, and updates will be provided once it is safe to resume normal activities.

RESPOND SA

The team welcomed the fact of lesser incidents to respond to as the related Summer month temperatures dwindle somewhat.

Of particular interest has been the Relief efforts implemented between City Hope KZN, Red Cross W.C and the Western Cape RESPOND team on Saturday 07 March in Du Noon, Cape Town. Herein, close to 500 families were ably assisted thanks to the generosity of donors, the logistical capability of the City Hope KZN team and willingness of volunteers who came to assist in the final distribution to families with niche supplies of Relief Aid that other agencies were unable to give.

A key focus remains the deepening of the capacity of membership along with financial sustainability. Communities of Abundance Africa, plays a vital role in such measures as we have secured a small tranche of financial assistance towards Fire relief with on-going support pledged by a donor. The team in the George municipality have also pledged to raise funding through the COA Africa portal due to our Section 18a capabilities and Ethical Financial governance structures.

At this time of the year, we turn our focus on Preparing for the Winter season and it's related aspects within high risk areas, especially within unplanned informal settlements. Mitigation projects such as our Water Pump and Sand Bag projects have begun in several of our areas of operations; Through several churches, the message of Preparedness is being reverberated, especially where such churches are in the middle of lower economically resourced areas.

We remain thankful to GOD Almighty for the privilege of serving the Body of Christ as the backbone organization to the Christian relief system countrywide.

Family Matters

March was a significant and impactful month for Family Matters, with strong progress across multiple focus areas.

Ongoing collaboration with Dewald has included marketing, planning, and the translation of the Marriage Seminar and Dad's Talk materials into Afrikaans. These will be ready for implementation on 19 April (Marriage Seminar) and 21 April (Dad's Talk).

On 6 March, Family Matters engaged with 700 boys at Klein Nederburg School. A large number responded positively, and 700 Gospel in 33 packs were distributed. Following this, the school principal requested an ongoing partnership, with the next session scheduled for 17 April (praise and worship).

On 13 March, a father-and-child engagement evening was hosted at Laerskool Drakenstein. The event was highly successful, with 55 fathers and their children attending. The session also included input on intentional fatherhood and promotion of the upcoming Dad's Talk seminar.

During the weekend of 20 March, a Pointman men's camp was facilitated in Wolseley in partnership with Dewald. The camp concluded successfully with strong participation.

On 25 March, Family Matters ministered at the Andrew Murray Children's Home in Wellington, including a praise and worship session and the distribution of 45 Gospel in 33 packs.
